EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & CHAIR OF THE BOARD

This community never ceases to amaze us! The Armstrong County Community Foundation experienced stellar growth in 2021. Although the pandemic kept us from socializing and visiting donors most of the year, we hosted our Annual Dinner in October at which we distributed grants totaling over \$100,000 to our nonprofit community.

In 2021, the Foundation:

- · Received a total of 12 new funds.
- Raised \$356,917.06 for 27 nonprofit organizations during the Week of Giving thanks to the partnership of NexTier Bank.
- Awarded over \$180,000 in high school and adult scholarships.
- Distributed over \$174,000 in Educational Improvement Tax Credit Scholarships (EITC).

The grant total in 2021 was \$740,242.12. All thanks to you, our community and donors, who make Armstrong County a great place to live and work!

We greatly appreciate all of our donors and friends with whom we have had the privilege to work during 2021. As the Foundation continues to grow and change, we see the importance of working together as one team. MARY DONNAN BAKER

Throughout her youth Mary was an active member of the Sewickley United Presbyterian Church and played the clarinet in the Sewickley High School Band. Mary attended Allegheny College where she met her future husband and graduated with a BS from the University of Pittsburgh School of Nursing in 1958.

Mary married Frank Tracy Baker from Kittanning, PA, on June 5, 1958, at the Sewickley United Presbyterian Church and became a public health nurse for the City of Philadelphia. After moving to Willingboro, NJ, she became an instructor of practical nursing at Lower Bucks County Technical School. Frank and Mary were charter members of St. Luke's Lutheran Church, Levittown/Willingboro, NJ.

They moved to Elderton in 1966 where Mary worked for Family Counseling as a traveling psychiatric nurse. She was active at St. John's Lutheran Church, Kittanning, with choir, social ministry committee, Sunday School, and the women's circle.

While in Morgantown, WV, she was on the faculty of the West Virginia University School of Nursing as a supervisor of the visiting psychiatric nursing trainees.

After Hurricane Agnes (1972), realizing that people were waiting weeks to find out whether their water was safe to drink, Mary and Frank, along with Robert and Sheila Alico, formed the EcoTech lab for water testing in 1973. Mary was the Office Manager for over 30 years.

Mary's volunteering and philanthropy grew out of a deep belief in the Golden Rule. Mary served on the Health Systems Agency for Regional Comprehensive Health Planning activities. She volunteered with Habitat for Humanity through mission trips to Haiti, home builds with Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter, and a family build in Coahoma, MS. She also helped to establish local chapters of Habitat for Humanity in Armstrong County, Indiana County, and the IUP campus. In 2015, Frank and Mary were the recipients of the Lutheran SeniorLife Excellence is Ageless award for exemplifying Lutheran SeniorLife's philosophy of Abundant Life and inspiring others through lifelong achievement and excellence.

Mary Donnan Baker passed away on Friday, June 4, 2021.

JOHN E. SHOOP



John was raised in Freeport and graduated from Freeport High School. He earned a bachelor's degree from Washington and Jefferson College and took a position with Proctor and Gamble. He also served in the Army for nearly two years and then the Army Reserve Field Artillery. Eventually, John returned to Freeport to run the family business, J. H. Shoop and Sons, which had the distinction of being the oldest family-owned men's clothing store in the United States. He carried on the family tradition until his retirement on Christmas Eve of 2005, marking 175 years of continuous service for the store.

Serving his community was very important to John. He was one of the founding fathers of the Armstrong County Community Foundation and served on its Board of Directors until 2011. John was passionate for his community; so much so that he established a Donor Advised Fund at the Armstrong County Community Foundation. Since 2005, the John Shoop Fund has awarded over \$25,000 to nonprofits dear to his heart.

John E. Shoop passed away Thursday, July 1, 2021.

2021 ANNUAL DINNER

The theme for the 2021 Annual Dinner was "YOU"! You, the donors, are the missing piece in the puzzle. Without you, we could not continue to support our nonprofit community. You are the missing piece in all that we do! Together, we make our communities better!

Grants were awarded at the dinner from the ACCF Founders' Fund and Donor Advised Funds. The impact of the evening was evident with over \$100,000 being awarded. The Founders' Fund is explicitly used to give financial assistance to interested and qualified non-profit organizations in and around Armstrong County. Over the past six years ACCF has contributed over \$300,000 to eligible non-profit organizations.

In 2021 our donors who established Donor Advised Funds who had not already awarded their grants during 2021 were invited to award them at the Annual Dinner. Many of the donors chose to announce their grants that night which impacted the dinner tremendously. Emotions ran high when our guests from the nonprofit organizations accepted their grants with no prior knowledge of the amount of money they were receiving!

MARSHA J. ALICO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Marsha Alico taught for Apollo-Ridge School District from 1972-2006, with 30 of those years teaching third grade. (A few of her later students were children of her early students!) Throughout all of those classes, there was not a single kid she did not care deeply about; and she kept every card and homemade gift they gave her, some for decades. She spent evenings, school breaks, and summers finding and working on new ways to engage her students; and she talked about her "kids" daily until her family felt like we knew them too.

Shortly after she retired, Marsha, who laughed easily and rarely stood still, was diagnosed with cancer and died after a courageous nine-month battle.

In her memory, we hope to help the next generation of teachers and child advocates pursue their degrees and inspire future kids.

GERSTBREIN/MCCANNA SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE ARTS

After a long and rewarding career in Landscape Design and Art Education, Lisa Gerstbrein McCanna wanted to promote the Arts and Industrial Arts in the community where she made her home and her livelihood. Her career brought her tremendous joy in pursuits that she loved as well as the satisfying reward of helping students find inspiration in the worlds of Art and Industrial Art. She is a true believer in the concept of STEAM based education. Accordingly, she established a fund to provide scholarships for the advanced education of advancing Senior High School Students in these areas who are residents of Armstrong County, Pennsylvania and are pursuing higher education in an approved program within 300 miles of their respective school - Armstrong High School, West Shamokin High School or Lenape Technical School.

- Nonrenewable
- · Applicant must:
- Be a senior at Armstrong High School, West Shamokin High School or Lenape Vo-Tech
- Be accepted at a 2 or 4 year accredited college, university, or technical school within a 300 mile radius of their respective high school. *Certificate Programs may be approved for Industrial Art studies
- Be accepted into a Drawing, Painting, Fiber, Ceramics, Sculpture, Structural, Design, Architecture, or Industrial Arts program. *Industrial Arts is defined as Carpentry, Cabinetry, Millwork, Furniture, etc.

STEPHEN L. HEFFNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Stephen L. Heffner Memorial Scholarship Fund was created by Stephen's family to provide funding for a high school senior or adult student. He is remembered by family and others as a loving man who treated everyone the same. Steve was involved with Ford City Movies in the Park, the summer basketball league, was a disc jockey with First Class Productions, and every Thanksgiving did a fundraiser for veterans and a turkey drawing. He raised money for a historic marker placed in the lower end of Ford City explaining how African-Americans moved from the South to Ford City to work at PPG Industries, Inc., and was a founder of the Ford City Renaissance Community Partnership. Steve was also an elementary teacher and taught in the state of California, Lenape Elementary in Ford City, as well as Shannock Valley Elementary in Rural Valley.

SAMANTHA L. SMITH SCHOLARSHIP

Samantha L. Smith was a Leechburg native and 2010 Leechburg Area High School graduate. Tragically, she died in a car accident in November 2011. Samantha, a passionate female athlete, played both basketball and volleyball for LHS. Her teammates voted her in as captain her senior year in basketball. Many friends, family, and teammates describe Samantha as "full of life" with a contagious personality. She loved to sing and made all those around her laugh. Although she is missed dearly by her family and friends, Samantha's memory lives on through the Samantha L. Smith Scholarship. Female athletes for generations to come will benefit from Samantha's love of sports and the friendships that emerge from becoming teammates. Samantha's legacy will positively impact Leechburg female athletes by awarding a yearly scholarship in her name at her alma mater.

THANK YOU TO OUR EITC PARTNERS!



The Community Foundation is approved through the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program to accept donations from businesses that are approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED).

What this means is that the approved businesses may contribute to the Community Foundation; and in turn, the Community Foundation awards scholarships to students wishing to attend private or faith based schools for Pre-K and K-12.



What is the advantage?

A business may receive a tax credit equal to 75 percent of its contribution to the Community Foundation up to a maximum of \$750,000 per taxable year. The tax credit may be increased to 90 percent of the contribution made, up to a maximum of \$750,000 per taxable year, if the business agrees to provide the same amount of contribution for two consecutive years.



What is the process for a business to receive the tax credit?

A business must apply to DCED for the tax credit. Tax credits are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis starting on the first day of the new fiscal year. Businesses can download an application at www.newpa.com/eitc. After approval by DCED, a business must make its contribution to an approved Scholarship Organization(s) within 60 days. Once the business receives confirmation of their donation and sends that into DCED, the tax credit will be awarded.








